Members / Visitors Code of Conduct October 2024

- **1.** These regulations are enacted and enforced by the Club's Committee, the latest copy will be available on the Club's website and on the Club notice board.
- **2.** The Club is affiliated to the LTA and the rules of the LTA and the Derbyshire LTA shall also apply.
- **3.** By visiting the Club, all visitors agree to be bound by, observe and comply with the latest Rules, Policies and Procedures (all available on the Club notice board and website).
- **4.** All visitors must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- **5.** Neither the Club nor any Committee Member can be held liable for any damage, injury or loss caused by any act or omission of a visitor. All Club visitors must comply with the Club's Health and Safety policies and procedures. Visitors must accept responsibility for their own safety and play at their own risk.
- **6.** On the courts, all visitors must wear appropriate sportswear and trainers.
- **7.** Visitors shall conduct themselves in a manner which reflects favourably on the game of tennis and the Club, particularly when in the presence of Juniors. Persistent audible obscenities, swearing, abuse or misconduct of any kind is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. Visitors should follow any rules set out in Club policies such as the Safeguarding Policy.
- **8.** We welcome new visitors to the Club irrespective of their experience of the game and their level of play.
- **9.** Club House furniture, crockery, glasses etc must be left tidy after use. There must be no smoking anywhere on the club premises. The last users of the premises must see that the Club house is properly locked.
- **10.** Parents/Carers must see that their children behave correctly and safely when on the Club premises.
- **11.** Pets on leads are welcome but are not permitted in the Club House. Pets brought to the Club must be on a lead and under control at all times.
